RESULTS OUT – WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

1. When the results are issued after 2pm on Tuesday 1 December, you will be notified by email if your daughter has met the qualifying standard. Each child who has asked to share their test result with Denmark Road High School will be given a rank position. The email will tell you whether your daughter has:
 - Scenario 1** – Qualified in the top 150 ranked students for Denmark Road High School.
 - Scenario 2** – Qualified for Denmark Road High School.
 - Scenario 3** – Not Qualified for Denmark Road High School.

We ask that you read your result email carefully, before contacting the school for clarification.

The result email is not an offer of a place but it will give you an indication of the likelihood of being offered a place at Denmark Road High School by Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) on 1 March 2021, providing you have submitted your secondary school preferences form to your Local Authority (known as the Common Application Form or CAF). You **cannot** be considered for a place or put on the waiting list of a grammar school without having met the qualifying standard.

2. **National Allocation Day - Monday 1 March 2021** is when you will hear from your Local Authority which secondary school your child has been allocated.
3. **Acceptance/Waiting List Process – Deadline Monday 8 March 2021** – Closing date to return your reply accepting your school/academy place or requesting to be put on waiting list/s (*if you live outside of Gloucestershire and were unsuccessful in gaining a place at a Gloucestershire grammar school you should contact Gloucestershire County Council directly to request to be put on a waiting list/s, providing your daughter has met the qualifying standard of a particular grammar school*). 4. **Waiting List outcome - after Monday 29 March 2021** – Parents are informed on the outcome of waiting list requests.
5. **By Wednesday 7 April 2021** – Closing date for return of acceptance reply, following waiting list offers.

What if my daughter didn't meet the Qualifying Standard and I placed Denmark Road High School on the CAF as one of my preferences?

Your daughter will **not** be considered for a place at Denmark Road High School (*or placed on the waiting list*) without having met the qualifying standard.

What if my daughter did meet the Qualifying Standard and I am not offered a place at Denmark Road High School on 1 March?

Your daughter will be eligible to request to be put on Denmark Road High School's waiting list providing you reply to Gloucestershire County Council by Monday 8 March 2021 – see point 3 above.

N.B. The Local Authority strongly encourage you to accept the school place offered, even if you go on another school's waiting list, to ensure your child has a school place in September 2021.

What if I am still not happy with my allocated school place?

If your daughter met the qualifying standard but was not offered a place because the school was filled with girls who ranked higher in the test, or you are dissatisfied with the way the admission procedures were carried out, or if you believe extenuating circumstances may have affected your daughter's performance on the day of the tests, you have the right to appeal to an Independent Appeals Panel. Details of how to appeal are available from the Admissions Officer after 1 March 2021.
