

Pupil Premium and Service Premium

2016-2017

- The school has been allocated for Pupil Premium and Service Premium £29,480 - this is for 41 students.

The High School for Girls will use this money to support processes and systems which will ensure that students in vulnerable groups are able to access the full curriculum and personal support for any barriers that they have to learning.

Examples of how the funding has been deployed this year:

Costs of Year 7 Bonding Trip in September for Pupil/Service Premium students. The students visit Croft Farm in Tewkesbury with teaching staff to undertake induction and team building activities. These activities enable them to make the transition and settle to HSFG school life more quickly, encouraging greater chances of success.
